One of volunteers, Selma made and individually wrapped 100 chocolate eggs; what a great surprise and treat. Ana spoke of Easter and how Jesus died for them and wants to change and make their lives better. Many of the kids came up front to be prayed for and accept the Good News. A good start for now, but we know that it will grow, and our kids will be a testimony for the region.

He does have a mother, Cida's daughter, but she is an addict and would abandon him on the street when she was on a binge. Cida would find him and take him home for months. Then she would appear; take him to her house so she could collect some government money designated for Vitor. Then the cycle would repeat, and Vitor would be abandoned and Cida would rescue him. The daughter would not sign the documents to release custody; Vitor could not even get into school, because he had no documents or birth certificate.
