So, we give our workers and teachers a small break and then get back on the streets, evangelizing, ministering and teaching the families. Chasing kids requires a lot of stamina and dedication. Please continue to pray over our workers for their health and safety.

One thing we did take advantage of was to fix the electrical at our school, Sorriso. We had wires hanging from the walls and ceilings, and broken and exposed junction boxes. It is a miracle that we never had a fire. Of course, it was more work than we anticipated. It always is, when you start opening walls, but it will soon be finished. Thank God for His protection that nothing happened to any of the kids before we got it all fixed. It will be one less thing we have to worry about, and we can serve these children in a safer environment.

Daniela is recovering from a horrible past. She now lives in a small shack in Vargem Grande. Her pastor is Dona Nete, who also runs our Sorriso school. The shack is a step up for her, because she has been on the street and in a shelter for the last 2 years. She once had a house with her children and husband. He was violent and beat her, ripped her teeth out and one day sold the house and all her and the children's belongings, leaving them on the street. She went to a shelter and started selling candy at stop lights to provide for her family. She made enough to move into this house. She is working hard and moving forward day by day. She has been able to raise her head by putting God first, and life has gotten better. Receiving this blessing just made God more real in her and her children's lives. Speechless and grateful was how we left her.

Felipe and Caterina live in the Mossoro neighborhood, and their pastors are Ana and Marcelo of Rendacao church. They are new converts and both are former drug addicts.

They owned a bar and that was their main source of income but felt convicted about their lifestyle. They knew it was a bad testimony for their community and children Gustavo, Douglas and Alice, so they sold it.
